WHITE SNOW PLAY DOUGH

You can use this recipe to make snow balls, snow stars (by using a cookie cutter) or even snowmen (pipe cleaners or cut up straws make great arms, and are great additions to any play dough activity!)

Ingredients:

1 cup cornflour

1/2 cup salt

1 tbsp vegetable oil

1 tbsp cream of tartar

1 cup boiling (or nearly boiling) water

a few drops liquid glycerine

(not essential, but makes it even smoother)

silver or white glitter (optional

but adds extra Christmas sparkle!)

Method:

Add dry ingredients and vegetable oil to a bowl and mix. Add boiling water to the bowl and stir continuously until it becomes a sticky combined dough. Add glycerine (if using), tip out onto the worktop (no need for flour) and knead for a couple of minutes until it becomes the perfect consistency. Add glitter (if using) and knead a little more to mix.

MERINGUE SNOWMEN RECIPE

ADD ½ TEASPOON OF PEPPERMINT EXTRACT TO THE MIXTURE TO MAKE THESE SNOWMEN EXTRA COOL

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 egg whites
- 3 tbsp caster sugar
- a handful of currants / other dried or candied fruit
- a dried apricot / glace cherry, thinly sliced

METHOD:

1. Place the egg whites in a bowl and whisk until they look like white, fluffy snow!
2. Gradually whisk in the sugar, a little at a time, until all incorporated and the meringue forms stiff peaks.
3. Line two baking trays with baking parchment.
4. For each snowman, make two blobs of meringue – a small one (about a teaspoonful) for the head and a larger one (a tablespoonful) for the body – on to the tray. You should be able to make 6 snowmen.
5. Decorate with currants for the buttons, eyes and noses and a small piece of chopped apricot or glace cherry for the mouth.
6. Bake at 120°C/100°C Fan/ Gas ½ for 2 hours.
7. Leave to cool in the oven. Peel off the paper.

HAND AND FOOT PRINT RUDOLPH

You will need:

- Brown card / thick paper (or you could use brown paint to put your prints onto white paper or card)
- Scissors
- Glue
- Something red – a milk bottle top, a circle of red card or tissue paper
- Two cotton wool balls / little balls of foil
- Cardboard insert from a toilet roll

Method:

1. Draw around two hands and one foot on the card and cut out carefully
2. Stick the hands (thumbs out – these are the antlers), onto the back of the heel of the foot (this is Rudolph's face!)
3. Stick on your something red - as Rudolph's nose - and the two cotton wool / foil balls (his eyes)
4. Finally, stick Rudolph's face to the toilet roll insert if you would like him to stand up and be admired!
